I pray this finds you all in good health.

"for all civil authorities and our armed forces; grant them, O Lord, peaceful times, that we in their tranquility may lead a calm and peaceful life in all reverence and godliness" (from the Liturgy of St. John Chrysostom).

 This Sunday, we look forward to hearing a testimonial from Jacqui Badaro, member of the Cathedral and President of our Ladies Society, the Antiochian Women of St. Nicholas, as we continue through this month to reflect on what should be our Christian response for all that God has done for us.

We will conclude these reflections the following Sunday, January 31, which is Stewardship Sunday at the Cathedral this year. That is the day we ask all to recommit their faith by pledging to be part of God's work. This is a basic way we make our faith

We ask you to consider prayerfully your stewardship commitment for the coming year. This is the pledge we make in support of our church operations and ministries for 2021.

- At the conclusion of Liturgy on January 31, we will offer a special prayer of thanksgiving for you, God's stewards, and ask Him to bless and reward all those who are recommitting to His Church.
- Then the clergy and Council members will proceed to put their pledge cards in the offering box.

- We respectfully ask everyone to follow and put a confidential pledge into the box.
- If you cannot be with us on the 31st, we ask you to mail back your pledge card.

Godly Giving

From "Dynamis"

What are your motives for giving?

- 1. **"Give with blessings"** (vs. 6). Most English translations contrast "sparingly" with "bountifully" or "generously" in the opening verse. In the original, St. Paul used the plural of the word "blessing," in contrast to "stingy." Hence, "one who sows stingily" differs from "one who sows with blessings." For the Apostle Paul, formed in the Hebraic mind, when speaking of blessings, he always is speaking of God. As the Psalmist says, "Blessed is the Lord, the God of Israel, Who alone doeth wonders" (Ps. 71:19). Only God is blessed, and all "blessings" flow from Him. The Apostle's point is that Christian giving always occurs in the context of the giving of God..
- 2. **"Give from the heart."** Of course the Apostle is speaking of the heart that is submitted to the Lord. A heart which belongs to the Lord neither grudges nor feels compulsion to give, but shares in the manner in which the Lord gives, "pressed down...and running over" (Lk. 6:38).
- 3. **"Give from joy"** (2 Cor. 9:7), or "Give merrily." The key word is "merry" or "joyous," in the original "hilarion." One invariably gives happily from a consciousness awash in the glad tidings that "God was in Christ reconciling the world to Himself" (2 Cor. 5:19). To know the Lord removes all reluctance and constraint, for He is the great treasure and ample food. Note how St. Paul changed Proverbs 22:9 LXX, from "God 'blesses'... to "God 'loves' a cheerful giver."

- 4. "Give from the abundance received from God" (2 Cor. 9:8). The Apostle promises to hearts that are united to God: "you always [will have] all sufficiency" (vs. 8). Hesitation to give freely, which is driven by the desire to "guarantee" one's own needs, is tempered by knowing God's abounding grace. Even those of very simple means, but who truly know the Lord, understand that they have a real measure of "abundance for every good work" (vs. 8).
- 5. **"Give to the poor"** (vss. 9, 10). The noun here describing the needy or the poor is "penesin," cousin to our English, penury, but alludes to those who are reduced to working just for bread, that is, for the bare necessities. To give to the poor cooperates with God in answering the prayer, "Thy kingdom come. Thy will be done on earth, as it is in heaven" (Matt. 6:10).
- 6. "Give, trusting that God will multiply" (2 Cor. 9:10). Among the practices which some of the excellent contemporary charitable organizations follow, for example, the International Orthodox Christian Charities, is to give toward building greater self-sufficiency, "getting the destitute on their feet." The Apostle speaks of Godly giving as having its source in God Who supplies seed to the sower and bread for food. There are some needs, however, brought about by overwhelming events such as drought, famine or war, which require us to supply basic seed and food, knowing and trusting that God will "increase the fruits of [our] righteousness" (vs. 10).
- 7. **"Give eucharistically" (vs. 11).** As one gives to the poor merrily from the heart, out of the abundance provided to oneself by God, trusting in Him to multiply our efforts, one naturally gives with praise and thanksgiving to the Lord. The two concepts, "praise and thanksgiving," fully express the single Greek word, "eucharistia," which we use to describe the quality of the Prayer of the Anaphora in the Divine Liturgy, which also truly expresses the whole Christian life.



Remember to sign up for every service

It is important so that:

- You won't drive all the way to church and find we're already at capacity.
- We will know who was here and so we will notify you if it turns out—God forbid—that someone who came down with CoViD was in church the same day you were.
- If you get sick, please be sure to let us know, so that we will pray for you and can help you and your family with whatever you may need as well as alerting others.

While we will continue to have services inside the Cathedral, you may choose to attend either indoors or outdoors. Chairs are set up under a tent in the plaza, in front of the main doors. A large screen TV will show the livestream of the service. For Holy Communion, one of the chalices will be stationed outdoors to serve those who are participating from there.

Summary of Our Plan for Indoor Worship

We will keep doors and windows open, and we'll have the HVAC fans going continuously.

Part of the price of going back inside is that we need to adhere *strictly* to procedures.

- You must sign up in advance to attend services. We need to limit capacity, and we also don't want
 anyone to drive all the way to church and be turned away because we reached our limit. <u>Sign up for</u>
 <u>Services at St Nicholas Cathedral (stnicholasla.org)</u> up until 7 am the day of the service.
- Please stay home if you have a fever, cough, sneezing, runny nose, etc., have tested positive for the coronavirus, or been exposed to someone who might have coronavirus within the last 10 days.
- Elderly, infirm, diabetics, and those who have asthma, heart conditions or compromised immune
 systems or any chronic illness are strongly advised NOT to come to Liturgy but to participate via
 livestream services and then to schedule an appointment to come and partake of holy Communion
 privately.

- Those who have children who might be hard to control, who might run around and touch people or surfaces, are also advised to participate via livestream and then to schedule an appointment to come and partake of holy Communion.
- We will do a very quick screening of everyone who comes to church, including taking your temperature without touching you.
- The faithful are <u>required</u> to wear face masks at all times, except when partaking of communion and except for children <u>under</u> 5 years of age.
- We will practice distancing in the church building.
 - o Come in only through the narthex; exit only via the chapel door.
 - We will maintain only one-way movement, so you never have to cross anyone else's path.
 - Enter and be seated via the center aisle. The center aisle will be used only for movement toward the altar. Westward movement (away from the altar) will be via the outside aisles.
 - Members of the same household may sit together. Ushers will seat you, one household per pew. To maintain maximum distance, they will seat you in alternate ends of the pews, from row to row.
- Please leave your tithes and offerings in the box in the narthex, as we will not pass any collection baskets.
- We will have our cleaning crew sanitize the building thoroughly before each service.
- Call or email Fr. Nabil directly (at frnabilh@stnicholasla.com) for an appointment to come privately for Communion.
- Please use a provided Clorox towel to wipe down surfaces before AND after you use the bathrooms.
- Note that coffee hour and all non-liturgical gatherings are <u>not</u> resuming at this point. Organizational meetings, Bible studies, etc., will continue online.


