

Beloved in the Spirit,

On the last day of the feast, the great day, Jesus stood up and proclaimed, "If any one thirst, let him come to Me and drink. He who believes in Me, as the scripture has said, 'Out of his belly shall flow rivers of living water.'" Now this He said about the Spirit, which those who believed in Him were to receive." (John 7.37-39a)

As we celebrate our post-pandemic reopening, coinciding with Pentecost—the fiftieth day after Pascha and its fulfillment—truly we can say that “The Holy Spirit has gathered us together!” This is indeed a great day, the great day of the Feast!



We are expecting a full house at the Cathedral on June 20, so we have arranged for overflow parking (see below).

You no longer have to sign up in advance to attend services, and you don't have to wear masks unless you choose to do so. Furthermore, you can sit where you want and no longer have to alternate ends of pews. If you or your children are not vaccinated, however, please take appropriate precautions, as it is now a matter of personal responsibility.

Note also that work is ongoing to replace our air conditioning system. Since the workmen generate dust during the week, we will not replace the seat cushions and service books in the pews until that work is done, so we can clean the pews more easily. We expect the work to take about three more weeks. We are, however, resuming distribution of printed bulletins in church, which will include the variations for the Liturgy.




