

The Sunday of Forgiveness, the last of the preparatory Sundays before Lent, has two themes: it commemorates Adam's expulsion from Paradise, and it accentuates our need for forgiveness.

There are obvious reasons why these two things should be brought to our attention as we stand on the threshold of the Great Fast. One of the primary images in the *Triodion* is that of the return to Paradise. Lent is a time when we weep with Adam and Eve before the closed gate of Eden, repenting with them for the sins that have deprived us of our free communion with God. But Lent is also a time when we are preparing to celebrate the saving event of Christ's death and rising, which has reopened Paradise to us once more



(Luke 23:43). So, sorrow for our exile in sin is tempered by hope of our re-entry into Paradise.

## **Order for Holy Communion**

Members of the Orthodox Church age seven and above must prepare for Holy Communion with a recent confession, prayer, fasting from all food and drink from midnight (unless a medical condition preclude it), being in church before the Epistle and Gospel readings, and being at peace with everyone.

**CHILDREN** going to church school and their teachers should come down the center aisle first. (Small children may need to be assisted by their parents.)

**ALL OTHERS** should wait until an usher dismisses your row from the center aisle. Then return to your place by a side aisle for the prayers of thanksgiving and the final blessing and dismissal. Please let choir members pass when they come down for Communion.

### A Warm Welcome to Our Guests

We are glad you are worshipping with us. Please note that participation in Holy Communion is limited to members of the Orthodox Church in good standing, who have prepared with prayer, fasting and a recent confession.

For all others: though we cannot share Communion with you—since it is an expression of membership and full unity in faith—you are welcome to come forward after the dismissal, receive a blessing and partake of the blessed bread (from the large bowls). Please also sign our guest book and introduce yourself to Fr. Nabil or Fr. Andrew during coffee hour. You may inquire with them how you can become a member.

works of darkness and put on the armor of light; let us conduct ourselves becomingly as in the day, not in reveling and drunkenness, not in debauchery and licentiousness, not in quarreling and jealousy. But put on the Lord Jesus Christ, and make no provision for the flesh, to gratify its desires.

As for the man who is weak in faith, welcome him, but not for disputes over opinions. One believes he may eat anything, while the weak man eats only vegetables. Let not him who eats despise him who abstains, and let not him who abstains pass judgment on him who eats; for God has welcomed him. Who are you to pass judgment on the servant of another? It is before his own master that he stands or falls. And he will be upheld, for the Master is able to make him stand.

# Holy Gospel according to St. Matthew (6.14-21; Forgiveness Sunday)

THE LORD SAID, "If you forgive men their trespasses, your heavenly Father also will forgive you; but if you do not forgive men their trespasses, neither will your Father forgive your trespasses.

"And when you fast, do not look dismal, like the hypocrites, for they disfigure their faces that their fasting may be seen by men. Truly, I say to you, they have received their reward. But when you fast, anoint your head, and wash your face, that your fasting may not be seen by men but by your Father Who is in secret; and your Father Who sees in secret will reward you openly.

Beloved Antiochian Women throughout our God-Protected Archdiocese:

What an appropriate time for us to emphasize the role of women in our Church! Later this month we will celebrate the Feast of the Annunciation, when the Virgin Mary learned that she would bear the Savior of the World and said "Yes" to God's plan for her. She accepted this role with faith and courage and remained faithful to her Son through all the difficulties that followed, enduring the sword that Righteous Symeon foretold would pierce her own soul also (Luke 2:35).

May it strengthen your resolve to continue working together in harmony for the glory of God and the good of the Church, doing your best and never giving up.



• **March 25** will be an exception, as we celebrate Liturgy for the Great Feast of the Annunciation.





#### TO BE READ FROM THE PULPIT AND PRINTED IN THE BULLETIN

Beloved Clergy and Faithful of our Archdiocese,

Blessings to you and your families in the name of our great God and Savior, Jesus Christ!

As we enter Great Lent—this consecrated season of repentance—the Church summons us to focus even more intently on drawing near to God. She shows us proven paths of approach to Him: not just fasting and prayer but also sharing our material blessings with others. From the saints we learn that charitable giving is not just about helping our neighbor, but even more importantly, it is a means of approach to God. St. Paul encourages us, "Do not forget to do good and to share, for God is well pleased with such sacrifices" (Heb. 13:16), and he thus teaches us that charity is a form of holy sacrifice—an act of worship that shows our love for God and invites Him into our lives.

In the same vein, St. John Chrysostom describes philanthropy as a holy and priestly ministry, urging us to "put on the vestment of philanthropy, which is holier than the priestly clothing." He goes on to exhort us: "When you see a poor believer, think that you behold an altar; when you see a miserable beggar, do not just refrain from insulting him but even reverence him" (Homily 20 on Second Corinthians). His words remind us that people in need do us a service, by providing us a way to show God love and honor. For, as our Lord said, "As you did it to one of the least of these my brethren, you did it to me" (Matt. 25:40).

With this in mind, over the past 48 years our Archdiocese has encouraged you to give alms during Lent through *Food for Hungry People and Charitable Outreach*. Once again, we appeal to your generosity and your love of God, asking you to offer God a gift by putting food and other necessities into the hands of the poor. May your gift from the heart be received by God as a pleasing and holy sacrifice, and may He give you in return the joy of His presence.

With prayers that we all be granted strength for the holy struggle ahead and that we be found worthy to celebrate joyously the victory of our Crucified and Risen Lord, I remain,
