

RIGHTEOUS FATHER MOSES OF ETHIOPIA
MARTYRS DIOMEDES, DAMON AND LAURENCE • MARTYR SUSANNA OF GEORGIA

Moses was by race an Ethiopian and his skin was black. He was the slave of an Egyptian official. Because of the general immorality and evil deeds of his life, especially his thievery, Moses was driven out of his master's house.

Moses was a man of huge stature and was famous for his gang of seventy-five thieves. Because of his great physical strength and courage, the robbers chose Moses to be their leader. This gang of thieves became a social menace and a living terror to the community. One morning while Moses was involved in evildoing, something happened—we don't know what—that caused Moses to repent of his evil deeds.

From that time on, Moses was found fervently embracing the work of repentance at the monastery of Petra at Scete, in the Egyptian desert. While fasting and during time of prayer and contemplation, the devil would bring back to Moses the memories of his past life and sinful habits, and would tempt him severely to fall away from his commitment to the Lord. After much time and prayer Moses was able to repent for the sins he committed and achieved sanctity.



In the year 400, at the age of 75, he was murdered by thieves who broke into the monastery.

Order for Holy Communion

Members of the Orthodox Church age seven and above must prepare for Holy Communion with a recent confession, prayer, fasting from all food and drink from midnight (unless a medical condition preclude it), being in church *before* the Epistle and Gospel readings, and being at peace with everyone.

As there are **NO CHURCH SCHOOL** classes today, children should sit with their parents and come to Communion with them. An usher will dismiss your row from the center aisle. Then return to your place by a side aisle for the prayers of thanksgiving and the final blessing and dismissal. Please let choir members pass when they come down for Communion.

A Warm Welcome to Our Guests

We are glad you are worshipping with us. Please note that participation in Holy Communion is limited to members of the Orthodox Church in good standing, who have prepared with prayer, fasting and a recent confession.

For all others: though we cannot share Communion with you—since it is an expression of membership and full unity in faith—you are welcome to come forward after the dismissal, receive a blessing and partake of the blessed bread (from the large bowls). Please also sign our guest book and introduce yourself to Fr. Nabil or Fr. Andrew during coffee hour. You may inquire with them how you can become a member.

Brethren, you are the seal of my apostleship in the Lord.

This is my defense to those who would examine me. Do we not have the right to our food and drink? Do we not have the right to be accompanied by a wife, as the other apostles and the brothers of the Lord and Cephas? Or is it only Barnabas and I who have no right to refrain from working for a living? Who serves as a soldier at his own expense? Who plants a vineyard without eating any of its fruit? Who tends a flock without getting some of the milk?

Do I say this on human authority? Does not the Law say the same? For it is written in the Law of Moses, "You shall not muzzle an ox when it is treading out the grain." Is it for oxen that God is concerned? Does He not speak entirely for our sake? It was written for our sake, because the plowman should plow in hope and the thresher thresh in hope of a share in the crop. If we have sown spiritual good among you, is it too much if we reap your material benefits? If others share this rightful claim upon you, do not we still more? Nevertheless, we have not made use of this right, but we endure anything rather than put an obstacle in the way of the gospel of Christ.

FEAST/FAST OF ST. JOHN THE BAPTIST ON MONDAY


We will commemorate the Beheading of John the Baptist tomorrow morning, Aug. 29, with

Matins 9 am; Liturgy at 10 am.

As St. Justin points out this day is a day of sadness second only to Holy Friday, and we commemorate the day by keeping a strict fast. A pious practice among some Orthodox people is not to eat food served on a flat plate nor to use a knife on this day.

Regarding this feast, St. Justin Popovich wrote:

Today is a little Great Friday, a second Great Friday. For today the greatest man among those born of women, John, the Holy Forerunner and Baptiser of the Lord, is murdered. On Great Friday, people murdered God, crucified God. On today's holy great feast, people murdered the greatest of all men.

On this day we also commemorate **St. Symeon the Stylite**, the renowned Saint of Aleppo (also known as Halab or Beroea), Syria.

Our righteous Father Symeon was born about the year 390 in the village of Sis, in the mountain region of Cilicia and Syria. Having first been a shepherd, he entered the monastic discipline at a young age.

After trying various kinds of ascetical practices, he began standing on pillars of progressively greater height (reaching 50 feet), and heroically persevered in this for more than forty years; the greater part of this time he spent standing upright.

He did not adopt this strange way of life out of vainglory, a charge that some of his contemporaries made against him at the first, because he was already famous for his asceticism and holiness before

ascending his first pillar (in Greek, style, whence he is called "Stylite"). The Church historian Theodoret of Cyrrhus, an eyewitness of his exploits, called him "the great Wonder of the world." God gave

him the grace to persevere in such an astonishing form of asceticism that multitudes came to see him from all over the known world.

He became so famous that the Nomadic Arabs by the thousands believed in Christ and were baptized because of him; the King of Persia sent envoys to inquire into his way of life, and the Queen asked to be sent oil that he had blessed. He also was a great defender of sound doctrine and confirmed the Orthodoxy of the Holy Council of Chalcedon for many who had been beguiled by the teachings of the Monophysites, including the Empress Eudocia, widow of Theodosius the Younger.

After a life of unheard-of achievements and struggles, he reposed in peace at the age of sixty-nine, in the year 459.
